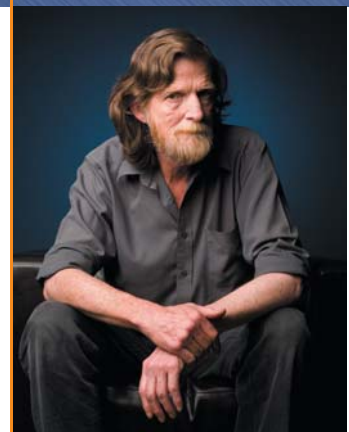

2009 National Earth Award Winner - Taylors Road St Albans Rail Underpass
Fiona Warren, Project Manager, Abigroup Contractors Pty Ltd

Despite the major challenge of causing the least amount of disruption to its local housing community, 200 rail services and 23,000 road vehicles each day, this project was completed within budget, within the time allocated and with no lost time injuries. Aided by implementation of a construction control agreement with accountable project stakeholders and authorities forming a Project Steering Committee, the projects work interfaces were effectively coordinated with Stakeholders clear and accountable for their respective roles and involvements in the project. This presentation will inform how this directive project management strategy worked.

Delivery of Victoria's Water Plan, Management of Alliances - Sugarloaf Pipeline
Melbourne Water

Water from the Sugarloaf Pipeline, a key part of the Victorian Government's Water Plan and part of a \$750 million pipeline project, started flowing into Melbourne's reservoirs five months ahead of schedule. The project was undertaken by the Sugarloaf Pipeline Alliance which took 16 months to finish the project with all the pipes being laid in nine months. This presentation will address how the Sugarloaf Pipeline, through the effective and efficient implementation of project alliances was completed well ahead of time and how this project strategy will affect the continued delivery of Victoria's Water Plan.

2009 National Earth Award Winner - Bogong Power Station Cable Installation
Jason Reid Managing Director, J & C Reid Earthmoving Pty Ltd

With cables that had to be installed down a 25 degree grade through a National Park across the West Kiewa River and then up a steep rock face to the Bogong Power Station, this project successfully managed the preservation of established trees, ensured the natural habitat of local wildlife was not greatly disturbed and that their environmental footprint was minimised. This presentation will showcase how this project managed the local environmental challenges through carefully considered cable route planning and became a National CCF Award winning project.

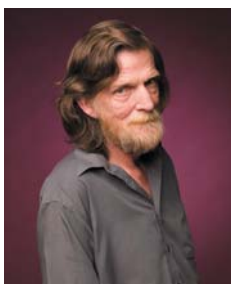
