Bardon Conference Venue


The Bardon Conference Centre and Guest Lodges is a unique and multi-faceted retreat situated only 6 kilometres from Brisbane's CBD. This award winning venue offers 7 acres of landscaped gardens surrounded by national Forest Parklands.

Accommodation

The Bardon Centre Guest Lodges offers 77 3.5 star rated air conditioned guest lodges, studio rooms and executive suites



with tea and coffee making facilities. Separated into three lodges, the guest rooms feature cottage style comfort with the addition of common kitchens and dens with fireplaces. A free DIY guest laundry and dry cleaning facilities are available and all rooms are serviced daily. Reception is available 7am – 8pm daily with check in 2pm and check out 10am. All major credit cards are accepted. Modem access and wireless broadband is also available from some of the accommodation rooms. Safety deposit boxes, DVD hire, photocopying, faxing and secretarial services is also available at reception for guests.

Transport

The airport is approximately 40 minutes from the Bardon Conference Venue and the cost of a taxi is \$30-\$40.

There is a bus stop 200m from the Bardon Conference Venue with a bus (no. 375) available from the city. Timetables are available from reception.



Attractions
