



# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This past year has been another strong and eventful year for the Victorian division of IPWEA.

Firstly I would like to acknowledge the support from my fellow board members including Geoff Glynn (Vice President), Mauro Covacci, Claude Cullino, Bruce Douglas, Ross Goyne, Thomas Kuen, Michael McGlade, David Powell, Vicki Shelton and David Sutcliffe. We must also acknowledge the high calibre of support and dedication provided by our Chief Executive Officer Dr. Anne Gibbs.

I am pleased to advise that our association is performing strongly with a membership around 400. The ongoing support and involvement of the membership is the reason for IPWEA's existence, with our success being reliant on our members, supporters, and sponsors, and their contribution to the Public Works Industry. I trust that the other members of the Board and I, with the tremendous support of our Chief Executive Officer – Anne Gibbs, have been able to create the opportunities for your involvement through meeting your learning needs, initiating opportunities for you to network with your friends, colleagues and industry contacts, actively represented the issues that matter to our industry and demonstrated leadership on key issues that require our strengths to be recognised.

It is terrific to see the regular activities of our Regional Groups in Geelong, Gippsland, Murray Goulburn, North-East Victoria, Wimmera Mallee, Central Highlands and Warrnambool and the Melbourne Metro area. In conjunction with the Asset Management Technical Reference Group and the Civil Construction and Technical Reference Group, these forums provide a great opportunity for learning and networking on key issues locally and across the state. The board appreciates the efforts of the various convenors of these groups who actively are endeavouring to create relevant and interesting forums for local members and others to participate in and enjoy.

I trust that members are gaining constant benefit and value from IPWEA's fortnightly online electronic newsletter with its links to current information. It is important that we are communicating with members on a regular basis to keep you apprised of the current industry issues.

A new initiative for this year has evolved from a joint workshop with Irrigation Australia Limited (IAL). IAL is Australia's leading organisation representing the breadth of the Australian irrigation industry. It has members covering all sectors of the industry, from water users, consultants, designers and installers through to educational institutions, government, manufacturers and retailers. IPWEA (Vic) and IAL have joined together to develop an Open Space Irrigation Program. The first workshop was held on 4 August 2010 with 21 keen participants. Funding is to be sought to develop some guidelines for the industry.

We have once again had a successful joint conference with the MAV - the 2010 National Local Government Asset Management and Public Works Engineering Conference which was held at the Regent Theatre Melbourne.

The conference agenda included outstanding speakers covering:

- >> The New Age: implications for Councils
- >> Sustainability and innovation: recycling, higher productivity vehicles, climate change
- >> Regional asset management collaboration
- >> Sourcing and developing staff
- >> New infrastructure standards
- » Good practice case studies

Included was our Gala Dinner, incorporating the 2010 IPWEA (Vic) Annual Awards for Excellence in Public Works Engineering. Congratulations to

- >> Darebin City Council for their Managing the Unavoidable - Climate Change and Peak Oil Adaptation Plan;
- >> Wellington Shire Council for their Kilmany Transfer Station and Resource Recovery Facility project; and
- >> Jon Aujard Campaspe Shire Council for his Paper on Determining Service Levels for Local Roads which was published in the February/March 2010 edition of the Public Works Engineering Journal.

We also had a successful joint conference with the Municipal Works Officers Association – the 2010 National Works and Engineering Conference held this year in Bendigo. A fantastic series of speakers provided information on alliancing, disaster recovery, road safety and procurement, in addition to practical demonstrations and toolbox

We highly value our strategic partnerships with the Municipal Works Officers Association, Municipal Engineering Foundation, Civil Contractors Federation, Engineers Australia, Municipal Association of Victoria, and Civil Works Expo and look forward to these relationships continuing strongly into the future.

This year has also seen IPWEA involved with the Department of Planning and Community Development on their Councils Reforming Business initiative. IPWEA was invited to be a member of a Statewide Governance Group to oversee the development and implementation of a consistent series of Engineering Standards for Infrastructure Design. Projects have initially focussed on the Gippsland and North-East Councils and the Growth Area Councils.

Our Association is also regularly invited to participate and contribute to state initiatives and forums. Over the past 12 months we have been invited to attend a briefing on the outcomes and achievements of the Victorian Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery Authority, to speak at the August 2010 Roads Australia conference, and make submissions to state issues including our submission to the VCEC - Streamlining Local Government Regulation project.

On the social scene, this has also been the first year of the IPWEA (Vic) Footy Tipping competition. I understand that this has been hotly contested and thoroughly enjoyed by those involved. We look forward to implementing this again for the 2011 football season.

There has also been active contribution on the National Board of IPWEA by Geoff Glynn and myself. It has been extremely important for us to represent the issues and experiences of Victoria in shaping the national scene. There is a growing sentiment and support from the state divisions for the implementation of national systems and efficiency improvements to ensure that each of the state divisions can operate and manage their local divisions effectively with the benefit of national support.

On other national initiatives, Thomas Kuen has continued to proactively represent IPWEA (Vic) on the National Asset Management Strategy Committee, with the most notable initiative being the release of the Australian Infrastructure Financial Management Guidelines. Thomas is also convenor of the Asset Management Technical Reference Group. A successful meeting occurred in March as a joint meeting with the Local Government Professionals Buildings Special Interest Group and was hosted by the Municipal Association of Victoria. The meeting included presentations from RMIT (Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology) on the sustainable management of community buildings and their teaching of asset management to their undergraduate students.

There are many other aspects and issues that have occurred throughout the year, and are summarised in the Annual Review.



- » AITPM & IPWEA (Vic) Traffic Skills Development Course. Traffic Skills Development course was held on 20 May 2010 at VicRoads. IPWEA (Vic) provided a member to present at the course from Wyndham City Council. The seminar was capped at 55 persons.
- Norton, Managing Director, Water & Power from Halcrow (UK) gave a presentation for Engineers Australia in conjunction with IPWEA (Vic) and AWA on the topic "Water Security the World is Watching Australia" in Melbourne on Wednesday 16th September 2009. The joint event attracted approximately 70 persons.
- IPWEA (Vic) End of Year Business Luncheon. Held on Friday 11 Dec 2009 at Malvern Valley Golf Course. Chris Champion outlined trends in public works engineering, four opportunities for public works engineers to note and an explanation of IPWEA's significant role in the ACELG.

- » Open Space Irrigation Program. IAL and IPWEA (Vic) have joined together to develop an Open Space Irrigation Program. Expressions of Interest were received from 19 people from 17 different organisations including 12 municipalities. The first workshop was held at EA boardroom on 4 August 2010 with 21 keen participants. Funding is sought to develop some guidelines for the industry.
- » Risk Based Approach to Road Safety Seminars. IPWEA (Vic) in conjunction with ARRB, RACV, VicRoads and SEITA and ConnectEast developed a half day seminar for traffic engineers and local road network mangers on tools to help manage road user risks. Two seminars were held one in Melbourne on 20 October 08 - with 22 delegates, and the second at Warragul on 21 October.
- » Accredited Public Works Training Courses. Ongoing discussions for development of an accredited IPWEA badged Graduate Certificate of Public Works Engineering and Management leading to a vocational Graduate Diploma and articulating into an MBA
- >> Participation in *Field Day* at Sandown Park by Geelong and Wyndham Councils
- >> Participation in RACV/Vicroads Roadworks Speed Limit Forum

### **INFRASTRUCTURE STANDARDS GOVERNANCE BOARD.**

The Victorian Department of Planning and Community Development is undertaking a project known as Councils Reforming Business. This project has identified infrastructure and housing affordability as primary targets for collaborative reform between Local Government, State Government and industry. The Local Government Procurement Strategy developed under the auspices of the DPCD has identified standardisation and improved practice as a key means of achieving cost benefits and delivering better community outcomes.

The project areas include focus on:

- >> Procurement and Financial Management;
- » Infrastructure and Assets Civil and Community;
- » ICT Strategy and cross-Government Interactions; and
- >> Local Laws and Regulations.

Three related projects are currently underway to deliver improved consistent infrastructure design standards across Victoria

- » An Infrastructure Design Manual (IDM) has been developed by the councils of Bendigo, Campaspe and Greater Shepparton and is now being considered by a number of regional councils.
- >> The 6 Gippsland regional councils are currently working towards implementation of the shared IDM through the Gippsland Infrastructure Design Manual Project.
- » The six growth area councils are working towards the development of a shared Infrastructure Design Manual.

IPWEA (Vic) is represented on the committee overseeing the management of Infrastructure Design Standards Manuals by Mark Varmalis. At the last meeting of the committee the roll out of the Manual to all councils throughout Victoria was considered. IPWEA (Vic) is participating in the roll out of the infrastructure standards manual through its regional group structure with Angela D'Costa from DPCD attending regional group meetings.

### **CIVIL WORKS EXPO**

IPWEA (Vic) could be found at stand NP24 at the CivilWorksExpo held at Lardner Park Warragul until between 19 and 21 Feb 10. Thanks goes to Kurt Pitts of BawBaw Shire for organising IPWEA (Vic)'s stand and the roster for manning the stand. Most enquiries from the IPWEA stand centred around the Plant and Fleet Manuals and courses.

# INTERNATIONAL PUBLIC WORKS CONFERENCE 6-10 SEPT






