AWARDS PROGRAMME

IPWEA (Vic) Awards provide an outstanding opportunity to recognise excellence in the innovation, development, construction and management of public works projects and services. The Awards celebrate the success of individuals or teams. Applications are sought from agencies involved in Public Works, including Councils, service authorities, Government bodies and private companies.

It should be noted that the Division may offer more than one award in each of the following categories if more than one of the nominees are worthy of that recognition. This flexibility is important to enable the Division to effectively recognize the significant diversity in agencies responsible for public works engineering and physical infrastructure services delivery.

The following categories are available;

1) Capital Project Award(s) ★

Design and/or construction of a significant public works infrastructure project of any scale that demonstrably adds value to the benefiting community.

This is a broad category, which can include projects ranging from structural engineering through civil engineering, hydraulics and hydrology, coastal and environmental engineering projects and may include roads, bridges, buildings, facilities, open space and traffic management devices. Submissions must show how they have addressed environmental issues. Consideration may be given to award of a Capital Project of a large scale (over \$1M) and of a small scale project (under \$1M).

2) Asset Management Award *

Projects that demonstrate best practice or the pursuit of excellence in the practice of Asset Management, and in particular show a whole of life perspective to asset management.

All projects must show how they have addressed environmental issues and include innovation and/or introduction of new and/or improved techniques and/or a link to the service provider.

3) Public Works Engineering - Innovative *

Delivery Award Initiatives that relate to the development and implementation of engineering process, systems or management practices or services in public works engineering that may be considered additional and/or exceptional to an agency's day to day activities. This category also provides for special projects, and may include activities in water, sewerage and waste water, and drought management.

4) IPWEA - "Public Works Practitioner of the Year" -People Awards ★

These awards are specifically targeted to individuals who have demonstrated a significant contribution to public works engineering and/or the community through initiative, achievement or service and are focused in two areas being:

IPWEA (Vic) Engineer / Technician of the year Young IPWEA (Vic) Engineer/Technician of the year

In the case of the Young Engineer/Technician, nominees must be under 35 years of age at the time of nomination.

ELIGIBILITY

Award categories 1, 2 & 3:

- ★ The nominee must be a member of IPWEA (Vic) and the nomination must be endorsed by the agency's Manager / Director / CEO.
- ★ In the case of a team nomination, at least one member of the team must be a member of IPWEA (Vic)
- ★ The project must have been completed in the 12 month period immediately preceding the closing date.
- ★ The service must be sustainable and operational at the time of nomination.

- ★ No project or service is too large or too small, with consideration being given to the size and resources of the agency and its staff.
- 4. "Public Works
 Practitioner of
 the Year" People Awards
- ★ The nominee must be a member of IPWEA (Vic).
- ★ The nomination must be endorsed by an IPWEA peer, the entrant's Manager / Director / CEO.
- ★ The entrant must qualify within the applied category.

AWARDS TIMING

The Division will publish notification of opening of awards nominations during August 2013 and nominations close at 5pm, Friday, 7th February 2014.

An awards evaluation panel (elected by the Division's board) shall determine successful awardees' projects which will be presented at the Annual State IPWEA (Vic) Public Works Management Conference Dinner.

ENTRY FORMAT

Award Nominations should be submitted electronically in both MS Word format and PDF format and can be emailed to agibbs@ipwea.org.au. Larger files can be submitted on a CD or USB.

Submissions should be suitable for publishing in the IPWEA (Vic) newsletters, IPWEA Magazine or for publicity purposes.

Submissions should be limited to 2000 words and the CD/USB should include an executive summary of 100 words (Microsoft Word format) with two high resolution JPEG photographs for possible use at the presentation ceremony.

Assessment will include the following attributes;

Use of Best Practice Engineering Principles and Technologies *** 20%**

Degree of originality and ingenuity of solution

*** 20%**

Program and project management ***** 15%

Benefit of the project or service to the Community **★ 5%**

Presentation of the award submission

The judging panel's decision on selecting awardees for an IPWEA (Vic) Award will be final and no correspondence will be entered into in relation to their decision.
